Background of the College with Vision, Mission and Objectives II.

Bharathi Women's College has entered into the 55th year of glorious educational service to the population of the North Chennai and its Suburban Region located along the shores of Bay of Bengal, qualified as neglected backward region. Founded in 1963 as Government Arts College for women, its quality and character was shaped by a host of dedicated Principals, Teachers as well as generation of brilliant students. This college was recognized by the UGC under 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act of 1956. The college was known for its academic standing and leadership building for women in this area from the time of inception.

During the centenary celebration of the famous Tamil poet Subramanian Bharathi in 1981-82 this college was renamed as Bharathi Women's College. Today the college has more than 4000 students and over 150 faculty members serving in 13 different departments. The college is located in the fairly large campus of 8 Acres, nested in the crowded North Chennai. This institution caters to the needs of economically and socially weaker sections of the society, especially the first generation of women learners providing curricula as well as sports and other activities.

The college was conferred Autonomy in 1998 and was accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 1999 with four star status and subsequently it applied for re-accreditation in October 2004. A peer team constituted by NAAC visited the college and reaccredited the institution with 'B' grade status. The Autonomy status was extended for the next five years for this college for the 13 UG and 13 PG courses by the UGC team which visited the college in 2012. Third cycle of assessment by NAAC was done in 2015 and re-accredited with 'A' grade status.

Research contributes content to teaching. Any quality teaching draws on quality research. Keeping this in mind, college engages its faculty in sound research by providing infrastructure and other support to promote multi disciplinary research and education in Arts, Languages, Social Sciences and Basic Sciences. Five M.Phil. and six Ph.D. research programmes integrate the education of a diverse population of students especially the first generation learners and the under privileged.

In a span of 50 years, Bharathi Women's College has grown almost 100 fold and its Alumni continue to serve the society as Teachers, Scientists, Administrators, Social workers, Lawyers, Software professionals and Home makers living monuments to the spirit of the motto of this institution.

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XVIII. Observations of the Committee:

- The College was established in the city of Chennai in 1964 and is affiliated to University of Madras, Chennai.
- The college is accorded with 2(F) and 12(b) status from UGC on November 1988.
- The college is spread across 8 acres but still needs to be beautified from green campus
- The college has adequate Infrastructure but a large part of which in dilapidated condition and requires thorough revamping. It also has ramps for the physically challenged students.
- The college featured between 100 150 NIRF ranking in year 2018-19.
- The utilization certificates of the grant received from UGC has already been submitted to the UGC Office for its account settlement.
- The syllabi nomenclatures are well up to the standard.
- The record keeping of the office of the Controller of Examination is very systematic. The system of examination is very well managed.
- Majority of the teachers hold Ph.D. degree the college has adopted the CBCS pattern of
- The students' record is exceptionally well maintained in each department.
- The college has the following committees:
 - 1. Sexual Harassment Committee
 - 2. Anti Ragging Committee
 - 3. Students Redressal Cell
- The central library has 55000 books and the departments also maintain their own library with adequate number of books.
- The extension activities undertaken by NSS, Sports and RRC clubs and specially NCC
- The faculty members have good number of publications and have been participating in
- The college has very active Parents Teachers Association.
- Out of 171 sanctioned posts more than 75% posts are already filled. The rest of the posts are could not be filled up due to the policy of the Government.
- The college has adequate hostel facilities. Food and kitchen hygiene is well maintained. However, the kitchen and dining hall need renovation.
- It is also observed that the college is committed towards the fulfillment of the goals.
- The college has an active Alumni association.
- Governing Body Meetings are convened as per University norms.

XIX. Suggestions of the Committee:

- The faculty must be encouraged to have more number of collaborations and CSR activities for generating funds.
- The faculty should make efforts to bring innovations in the academic programmes through MOOCs.
- The laboratory infrastructure needs to be revamped.
- The College should focus on cashless transactions and digitalization in financial transactions.
- Smart Classrooms can be established.
- The College needs to have waiting room for the parents in the hostel.
- As it is a women's college, a day care centre should be established in the future.
- A Health Care Centre must be maintained for medical supervision.
- Solar system may be installed in the campus to save energy.

XX. Recommendations of the Committee:

• The Expert Committee visited Bharathi Women's College (Autonomous), Chennai on 18 and 19 July 2019 which is one of the oldest women's college in Chennai. The committee examined the academic activities, infrastructure, examinations system, college administration, and also interacted with the students, teaching, non teaching staff members, PTA members and Alumni and the committee recommends extension of autonomy for Five years from the year 2018-19 to 2023-24.
